

Indian Laws & regulations

Act June 30th 1834. Regulating
trade & intercourse with Indian tribes &c.
§1. All parts of U.S. west of Miss. R.
except Ia., for purposes of acts to be
deemed Ind. Terr.

See former "regulations concerning
the granting of licenses to trade with Indians with
the Indians." p. 79. (Nov. 9, 1824)

2. No person to trade with Indians without
a license or permit (as before) as herein far as
the first of the regulations
3. Super. may refuse license in certain
cases.
4. Priest. U.S. may "prohibit the introduc-
tion of goods or of any particular article
into the country belonging to any Ind-
ian tribe."

4. Any one attempting to reside in his
country as a trader, or introducing goods
to profit made in his possession a
penalty. (follows Sec no 2)

5. No license to be granted except to
citizens of U.S. (follows Sec 2)

6. Foreign without passport & forfeit £1000. if found in Indian country.

7. Any one purchasing from Ind. any article except pottery to forfeit £50.

6 hr modified at least

8. Any one keeping stock on any "land belonging to any Indian or Indian tribe" without consent to forfeit £1 per head.

10. Sept authorizes to return by force persons found in Ind. country contrary to law.

11. Persons making settlement on lands

deemed to Indians by treaty to forfeit £1000 & shall. may remove him.

12. No purchase & be sold [of land] except by treaty or cession.

Any unauthorized person treating to forfeit £1000. Except State Agents, etc.

§. 13 & 14. 15. Relates to communications or tables with Indians on construction of treaty.

16. Injuring to property of Indian by a white "in the commission of any crime" to be compensated by double the amt. Treating to pay deficit: proviso.

17. Any Indian taking or destroying property of a white, tribe to make satisfaction. [Indians in treaty with U.S.] U.S. guarantees indemnification. In what cases.

18. Superintendents to be authorized & take depositions under law proceeding action.

19. Duty of Sept to arrest Indians accused of crimes committed within any State or Territory & filed with Indian country.

See also Act March 3, 1834 § 20. Any person selling to Indians or
imprisonment for 1 year in first case, Indians in Indian country to pay \$500/
for 1 yr. in second. In all processes—any person introducing it, except for bad
wines under 20th section of former act. Slavery purposes to forfeit \$500.
or under the Amendment, Indians. Sup't. to search for & seize liquor
shall be competent witnesses.

Any person to be fined the sum of \$1000.
Penalties to be applied to persons in debt,
(see also Regulations War Dept. Apr. 9, 1837)
expelled or punished by the process.

21. Persons setting up distillery to forfeit
\$1000.

22. In all trials about rights of property
between an Indian & a white man, the
freedom of evidence to set on either when
an Indian shall make out a pre-
sumptive title, from fact of previous
possession.

23. Authorizes military force to be
employed for removal of persons in
Indian Territory contrary to law.

25. To punish of U.S. laws as provided
for punishment of crimes committed in
places without due jurisdiction of U.S.

to apply to Indian Territory. Not to
extend to crimes by one Indian against
another.

27. Penalties according to the law act
to be incurred in debt, acts U.S. before
any court having jurisdiction of same—
to penalty to U.S. to be informed.

28. Action against persons engaged
to be in rem as in revenue cases

29. Certain acts & parts of acts re-
pealed.

To provide for organization of the De-
partment of Indian Affairs.
Act June 30, 1834.

33. Superintendent of Ind. Affairs to
exercise general supervision over con-
duct & affairs of office to be employed
in Dept. under regulations established
by Pres. May suspend from office

4. Certain agencies constituted
with 4 yrs. salary \$1500. other
agencies abolished. bond \$2000.

Prest authorized to discontinue
a certain agency. Order

5. Comptroller number of sub-agencies
to be appointed - Salary \$150. bond 1000.
^{not} agent above an agent.

6. Limits of agencies & sub-agencies
to be established by Secy of War.

General duty of Agents, & subs.

8. Interpreter to be allowed. Salary
\$300. to be nominated to Secy for
approval. Persons of his descent to
be preferred.

10. Compensation to be in full of
all emoluments or allowances. Pro-
vision may however be made for
Officer & office contingencies. Persons
required to leave & have their expen-
ses allowed. (see Inst. June 1, 1851. § 39.)

11. Amendment. Act March 3, '47. Authorizes pay to heads of family
no pay to be made while under
the influence of spirits.

All executive contracts entered
into by any Indian for the pay of
of money or goods, null void.

13. Miscellaneous required by Indians
what how purchased.

Suspending Agent to be pres-
ent & certify to delivery & pay to
Indians.

Accounts of disbursing officers
how to be settled.

14. No person employed in Indian
department to trade with them.
Penalty \$5000. & removal.

16. Prest authorized to cause Army
agents to be issued to Indians, when
etc.

17. Prest to prescribe regulations for
carrying out acts relating to Indians.

Revised Regulations No. III Adopted
June 1, 1859.

Directs general duties of Supervisor
Agent, Agents &c.

12. Agent to prepare annual statements
exhibiting the number in which the
farmers he has been employed. Num-
ber of lots he delivered - number of foreig
kinds of cultivation, amount & descrip-
tion of produce. Number of Indians
instructed in arts &c.

13. Agent to transmit to Super. statement
of number of each tribe under his charge
distinguishing those employed in chase
agricultural or mechanical pursuits
- a map showing location of each band
or tribe - sites of public buildings.

14. Agent to transmit list &c. of employes

15. All reports to each War Dept
by October 1st

29. Words "actual boarding expenses"
embrace all necessary expenses while
traveling about on the business -
stage Steamboat fare - house hire,
foreign subsistence by the way and
such other reasonable expenses as the
agents are subject to, over & above
what they would expect if station-
ary."
